DRUG CALCULATION COURSE TAUGHT

Two courses for registered and practical nurses in the community will be offered next month by the Division of Continuing Education at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Starting April 2, a five-session class will be offered for those RNs and LPNs, returning to their profession, on the simple mathematics needed for calculating dosages.

Mary Jane Watson, assistant professor of nursing, will teach the class entitled, "Drug Calculations," meeting 5 to 6 p.m. Wednesdays through April 30.

"Human Sexuality and Nursing Intervention," a class designed to help

community overcome their fear and reticence in discussing problems of sexuality with patients, will be taught by Rosemary Witt, assistant professor of nursing at UNLV.

This noncredit class, meeting 6 to 8 p.m. Wednesdays April 2 through April 30, will teach nurses how to take sexual histories as well as how to help patients get over some of the sexual myths connected with certain major illnesses.

Registrations are now being accepted for both of these classes by the Division of Continuing Education in Frazier Hall, UNLV.

The District Health Department has scheduled free immunization clinics and free well child examinations for Clark County families.

Well Children exams are available by appointment only for children up to four years old at Panama Clinic in St. Timothy's Episcopal Church in Henderson, from 8 a.m. to noon Wednesday.

abnormalities are observed.

PRISONERS MISSING VA BENEFITS

A recent report compiled by the Government Accounting Office, GAO, has disclosed that the Veterans Administration has no uniform system for reaching veterans in penal institutions to encourage them to take advantage of the VA benefits available to them. Yet, the VA is required under the Veterans Education and Training Amendments Act of 1970 to provide outreach service programs to all veterans, including those incarcerated in, or recently paroled from penal institutions. In fact, discussions with a selected number of veterans in those categories showed that most were not aware that they were still entitled to VA benefits.

Several of the VA Regional Offices reviewed had adopted a policy of visiting penal institutions only upon specific requests by prison officials.

The GAO recommended that the Administration of Veterans Affairs require VA regional representatives to visit state and federal penal institutions at least semi-annually to advise prison officials and inmates about the various benefits available to incarcerated veterans; and in addition, that VA develop and distribute pamphlets and other literature specifically aimed at motivating veterans to use the benefits available to assist them in readjusting to society.
