NEW YORK CITY---Dr. Berkley G. Burrell, prez of the National Business League, is taking the next step in the drive to create the help and atmosphere conducive to a healthy Black business community. Through the 1st annual Booker T. Washington Memorial Dinner he will set in motion the building of "The Booket T. Washington Foundation." The idea was born in 1967 in the waning years of "riots" and civil disturbances in the ghettos of major inner cities to emphasis the thirst and thrust for total freedom. In the pangs of a lagging economy, and the effects of "the last hired-first fired" axiom, the goals and the needs of the foundation was never more prevalent. Its purpose, as charter outlined, is to encourage and assist minorities to enter and maintain themselves in business. The elimination of discrimination in affording business opportunities through education, skills and techniques and establishing other organizations to assist in planning and financing these allied projects. The B. T. W. Foundation thrust will be hi'lited in DeeCee April 5th thru an appropriate salute to Dr. H. Naylor Fitzhugh, the pioneer super-marketeer and professor whose wisdom and counsel has aided so many for so little personal gain. The two-fold purpose of this event makes it hard for any of us to turn down.

The FCCommission has denied a petition by the Puerto Rican Media Action and Educational Council against the Educational B'casting Corp., license of noncommercial educational station WNET-TV, Newark, N. J. With studios in Manhattan, it is better known to its huddle of habitation as Channel-13 over whose eye-cycles "Black Journal" is viewed. The Commish's dissenting statement came from the Hon. Benjamin L. Hooks. In the opening paragraph of his 7-page opinion he wrote: "WNET, the radiant jewel in the Public Television's crown, is unquestionable a media symbol of sophistication and urbanity whose programs I, along with millions of other Americans of every race persuasion, and background, have watched and frequently enjoyed. WNET does not, however, serve the public interest and I cannot put an approving imprimatur on its licenseeship by dismissing the instant complaint." Further along in his dissent, the FCC's only Black member stated that the station in question had glaring deficiencies and it has failed to live up to the purpose for which

it was conceived and licensed. Jack Saunders, prexy Phila Trib; Moses Newson, Afro; William Rasberry, DeeCee Post spent most of a wk in "Fun City" matching "4th Estate" knowledge with some 50 jurors to select this yr's Pulitzer Prize in 11 journalism categories. They were historically invited by William J. Mc-Gill, prexy of Columbia U where the selections session took place. Winners will be announced in May, and none of the first Blacks to ever serve will scoop-leak the findings...Patricia Hearst made the national headlines via the print and electronic media just in time to call attention to Ed Bullins' new off-B'way play, "The Taking of Miss Janie."
