

JOB TITLES CHANGE

Major league baseball players may have to call the "bat boy" the "bat keeper."

And, the city editor's call for a "copy boy" may get no response unless he says "copy messenger."

These are some of the results stemming from changes made in the U.S. Labor Department's Dictionary of Occupational Titles (DOT) to rid the publication of age and sex connotations.

Nearly 3,500 job titles had to be revised to achieve some degree of neutrality and sexlessness among the 35,000 job titles in the book.

The job was done to minimize any inequity or discrimination that might come about through using job titles with sex or age in recruitment and hiring practices.

The main DOT will not be published until 1976. However, the Labor Department's Manpower Administration will issue a publication containing the revisions in the near future and will be on sale by the Superintendent of Documents.
