DAN CURTIS FILES FOR WARD THREE



Danny Curtis, a native resident of Clark

County, has filed for the Las Vegas City Commission post in Ward 3.

Curtis, 35, says he is running because he knows "the needs and demands of the greater Las Vegas area." He feels his ward in particular needs more attention than it has been given in the past.

A sports enthusiast, Curtis is the sports editor of the Las Vegas Voice weekly newspaper. He is a board member of the Greater Las Vegas Plan, Secretary Treasurer of Green & Associates, Inc., and a member of the NAACP. In addition, he is President of the West Las

Vegas Businessman's Association and is active in many other community projects.

Believing sincerely in the economic development of Clark County, Curtis would like to see more industry brought into the state to provide jobs. He feels that Clark County should also take greater advantage of the Federal tax dollars that are allocated to Nevada to aid the unemployed and underprivileged.

Danny Curtis is married to Barbara Jean, who is employed at the Las Vegas Convention Center in hotel reservations.

World record holder ROSALYN BRYANT in UNLV RELAYS

Rosalyn Bryant, who holds the women's indoor mark for the 100 and 220 yard dash-14 and over, won easily this past weekend, in these events, the the Las Vegas/Southern Nevada Bicentennial Relays at UNLV.

Bryant, who runs under the colors of the Mayor Daley Youth Foundation in Chicago, faced little competition even from UNLV track star, Beatrice Emodi. She paced the 100 yard dash with 10.3, Emodi her closest competitor with a 10.8, and Emma Jean Major, another UNLV track star, ran a distant 11.2.

In the 220, Bryant ran 23.6, followed by Sandra Muse at 25.4. Emodi came in on the heels of Muse to hit the tape at 25.6, she was followed by Corlina Garduno at 26.0.

Although Bryant set her world record marks earlier this year, she is still not too well known. She caused a little suspense in the relays, by waiting until the deadline Saturday, to announce that she was entering the events.

Bryant recently broke the 220-yard dash record's of Wilma Rudolph, which stood for

nine years.

Lawrence Albert, publisher of the Las Vegas Voice, said, "He feels she should get more invitations to indoor-outdoor track meets since she did break Rudolph's record."

"She should be highly recommended for the 1967 Olympics. Her ability also has been underrated, because she doesn't have sponsors. The VOICE would be glad to sponsor her."



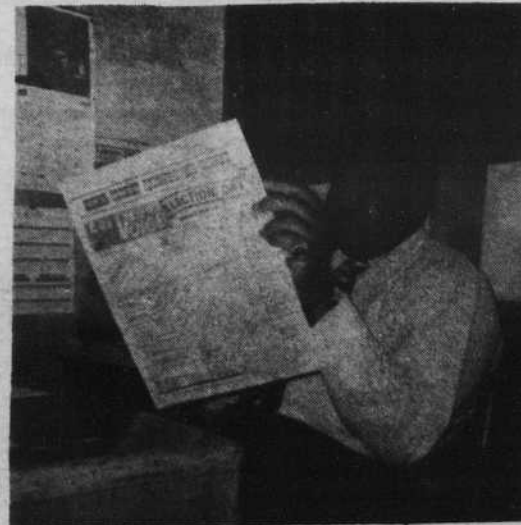
over Lynch's spot until a permanent replacement is found.

Several reasons for his dismissal were listed in the letter to remove Lynch--misuse of city property, attempts to write off personal bills to the city and failure to hire an assistant.

Lynch will continue to receive his \$35,000 a year salary until July 30. He said he has no immediate plans, but would remain in the city and maintain close ties with City Hall. He also agreed to be available as a consultant to Boddy during the transition of power.

Lynch said, "Even when there's some happiness, there's still some sadness. When the majority of the council and the mayor lost confidence (in me), it was necessary for me to step down."
