The slow start of Ms. Elliott was due to the questioning of her eligibility, by the City Clerk, to to run for that office. The Clerk had said that Ms. Elliott had not been a registered voter for the required length of time, which is two years.

However, City Attorney, Carl Lovell validated the candidacy of the Ward Three hopeful. Lovell ruled, although real estate agent Elliott may not have been a registered voter at the beginning of 1973, as suggested by the City Charter, she came close enough. She re-registered April 26, 1973.

Lovell interpreted the Charter by saying, "The interpretation of the Charter is that as long as a citizen is a qualifed voter during the two years prior to the election year, in which he seeks office, he is qualified as a registered voter."
