The Concert entitled THE BLUES IN SWAHILI incorporates startling new concepts in bush rhythms-jazz-rock flavored songs. BLUES IN SWAHILI traces the characteristics of Central African music and illustrates forms that give "jazz" much of its influence in the United States today. The history of jazz dates back centuries ago when Africans assembled in the evening around the tra-ditional fires to play and enjoy the "jass sasson", which later became popular in America as the jam

Onago, trained by the Bakwango nation located southeast of Kasai, is one of the world's greatest Kumbwaya players of jazz percussion, with more than three hundred rhythms of piano, watusi and

Muana, who is half-Egyptian has an amazing vocal versatility and is expert in such native forms as chants, calls, falsetto breaks and responses.

In addition to performing concerts in Europe, the Bahamas and the United States, Onago and Muana have recorded three albums: "The Heartbeat of the Congo," "Drums of Africa" and the "Roots of Rhythm."

Onago and Muana perform THE BLUES IN SWA-HILI free to the public at 7 p.m. Tuesday, April 15th at the West Las Vegas Library and on Wednesday, April 16th at the Flamingo Library.


