Absentee registration on

In-Office absentee voting for registered voters in Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City began on Monday, May 19 and will continue

through 5 p.m., May 27.

Registered voters in Boulder City and Henderson, should make their requests to their respective city clerks; residents of Las Vegas, required to vote by absentee, should make their requests to the Clark County Election Department, 400 Las Vegas Blvd., South.

In-Office absentee voting is for those who will be leaving town on or before Election Day and will be unable to receive an absentee ballot through the mail. Voters who fall into this category can take advantage of this absentee voting procedure. All absentee ballot requests must be received by 5 p.

m. May 27; any requests received after that date are too late for processing.

From May 28 through 5 p.m. on Election Day, the Election Department will receive emergency absentee ballot requests for people suddenly called out-of-town on business or emergency. Absentee ballots can also be requested during that same period for people who have been hospitalized or confined to their home due to illness.

AUSTIN, Tex., -- The executive committee of the African Literature Association, which held its first meeting recently at the University of Texas, will have as its chairman, Dennis Brutus, visiting professor of English at UT this spring.

Brutus, who teaches English at Northwestern University, is a South African poet who was exiled for his statements against the Apartheid system in that country.

Prof. Davis Dorsey of Atlanta University will be vice chairman, and Prof. Thomas Hale, of Pennsylvania State University will serve as secretary-treasurer of the organization.

Committee members appointed to three year terms are Prof. Daniel Kunene of the University of Wisconsin, Prof. Cosmo Pieterse of Ohio University, and Prof. Bernth Lindfors of UT Austin.

Those serving two year terms are Pitka Ntuli, a South African artist studying in New York; Dapo Adelugba, an instructor at the University of Ibadan, Nigeria, an a former visiting faculty member at UT Austin, and Eileen

Julian-Over, a graduate student at the University of Wisconsin.

One year terms will filled by Diedre Gomez, a graduate student at the University of California, Prof. Alain

Ricard of the University of Bordeaux, France, and June Brewer of Cornell University.
