MAC'S TRACKS

This past weekend I traveled to Bakersfield, California to watch the 1975 Southern California State Junior College Track and Field Championships. Bakersfield Junior College won the Southern California Junior College title (their 5th in six years). Glendale Junior College finished third. As a graduate of Bakersfield Junior College, I was very pleased with the whole affair. The best of Southern California competed for top four will meet the top four from Northern California on Saturday, May 31 at Bakersfield for the California State Junior College Championships. Needless to say, I will be there.

There were some very good 5th place performances that did not qualify for the state finals: 440 relay-Mt. San Antonio College (41.4); Mile-Saavedra of Fullerton Junior College (4:07.3); 440 Yard Dash-Peete of Long Beach Junior College (48.3); 880-Lagorio of Pierce Junior College (1:51.7); and Mile Relay-Long Beach Junior College (3:14.6).

I spoke with five junior college athletes who are very interested in our track program at UNLV:
 --Bob Trippett-Bakersfield Junior College. Bob won the 100 yard dash (9.6) and anchored his 440 relay team to a third place (41.2).
 --Art Bell-Bakersfield Junior College. Art placed third in the 440 yard run with a time of 47.3 and anchored his mile relay team to second place (3:11.9). He ran a 46.2 anchor leg.
 --Jorgenson-Palomar Junior College. He placed second in the pole vault with a best mark of 15'6".
 --Al McClure-Palomar Junior College. 6'8" in the high jump and 49'10" triple jump.

--Alberto Barajas-Palomar Junior College. Alberto placed second in the steeplechase with a time of 9:18.0. He was seventh in the state in cross country.

I should have an answer from these athletes within the next two weeks. With the athletes we have returning, the local recruits we have already signed, this group of prospective recruits could give us a very strong team in 1976.

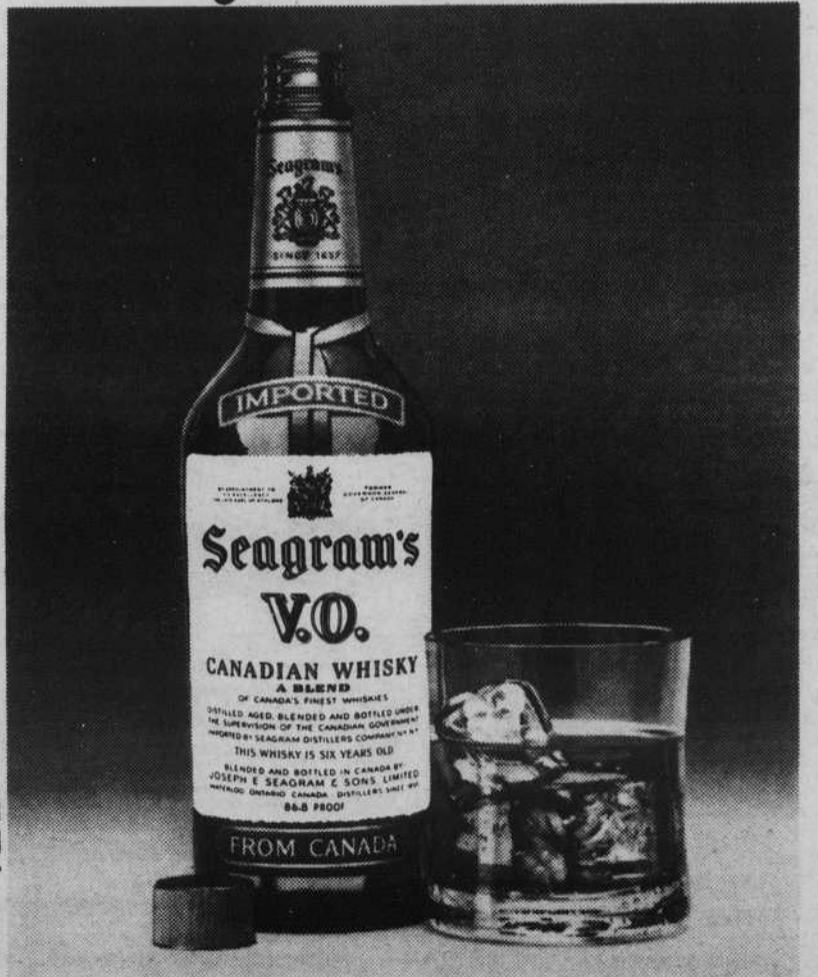
