

## ORAL DISEASE HIGH IN U.S.A.

Oral disease is rampant in this country, Harold Miller, DDS, MHP, writes in a journal for pharmacists.

"One hundred million of your fellow citizens have never seen a dentist," he states.

"Thirty million are toothless...The fact is, if every dentist spent 24 hours a day, every day, for one year, just filling cavities, there would still be one billion unfilled cavities."

According to the dentist, a preventive

home regimen should include the total removal of plaque (the sticky material that forms on the tooth surface and eats away at the enamel) by toothbrush, dental floss and any other device the dentist may recommend. The brush should have a straight handle, with a small multitufted head, featuring soft rounded bristles.

According to other sources, some individuals put off toothbrushing or don't brush at all because it hurts to do so.

For teeth that overly sensitive there is a special toothbrush that fits these requirements and a dentrifice to be used with it, both of which are called Sensodyne.

Dr. Miller and other dentists and dental researchers have observed that once the novelty of preventive techniques wears off, enthusiasm for following them diminishes too.

"Prevention must be practiced not for a day or a week, but for as long as we live," Dr. Miller warns.
