Rebels elect captains for '75 season

Four seniors and one junior have been elected by their teammates to captain the 1975 UNLV Runnin' Rebel football team, it was announced today by head coach Ron Meyer. The election was held by the 43 Rebel gridders.

Elected by their teammates on defense were All-American tackle Joe Ingersoll, linebacker Mike Otto, and free safety Marlon Beavers. On offense, the 1975 Rebel captains will be wide receiver Mike Haverty and guard Bob Chess.

Ingersoll, Beavers, and Haverty are all from Las Vegas, while Chess is from Oceanside, Calif., and Otto hails from Grand Junction, Colorado.

Meyers, obviously pleased by his team's choices, commented, "These five young men are beautiful examples of what our Rebel football program is all about. I couldn't be happier with

the selections and all five will represent UNLV and the team with pride this fall." Ingersoll, who played his high school ball at Skyline High School in Salt Lake City, was second team All-American on the Associated Press team and the first team All-Coast on the UPI team. At 6-2, 262, he has led the Rebel defense for the past two seasons and is also a UNLV record holder in Track. If he performs to his capacity next season, he is considered by many pro scouts to be a first round prospect for the annual NFL draft.

Otto, transferred to UNLV last season from Mesa JC in Grand Junction, set a UNLV defensive school record with seven opponent fumble recoveries during the course of the undefeated (11-0) UNLV regular season. He was also second to Ingersoll in defensive scoring for the nationally ranked Rebels.

Beavers, the only junior honored as captain by his peers, is a graduate of Rancho High School in North Las Vegas. Already, in just two seasons, he has set a UNLV career interception record of nine. His deceptive speed and great agility have helped him return his interceptions for an average of 29 yards each, including a 98-yard touchdown against Arizona State University last season.

A graduate of Clark High in Las Vegas, Hav-erty is one of the hardest-working athletes ever to wear a Rebel uniform. He is considered to be a coaches dream in his attitude and determination, and last year led the Rebels in pass receiving, ending the year with eight catches against Delaware in a nationally televised game.

Chess is the Rebel pro prospect in the offensive line. It is a great honor for an offensive lineman to earn this honor, but the UPI All-Coast star definitely has.
