Q -- How do I go about getting the \$150 annual clothing allowance certain disabled veterans receive from the VA?

A -- If you wear a prosthetic or orthopedic device for a serviceconnected disability which tends to wear out or tear your clothing, all you need do is apply to the nearest VA office.

Q -- I bought my first home with a GI loan, and am now considering purchase of a new house. Should I obtain a release from the Veterans Administration before negotiating for my new home?

A -- Veterans are cautioned to obtain a "release from liability" from VA if the purchase of a house bought with a GI loan assumes the loan, Otherwise, the seller (veteran) could be held financially liable should the purchaser default on mortgage payments.
