BLACK NAMED DISTRICT COURT JUDGE

Addelair Guy, 51, a deputy Clark County District Attorney for the past nine years, will be sworn in July 15 as the first Black to be appointed to a District Court judgeship in Nevada.

Guy was appointed Friday to the post by Governor Mike O'Callaghan. The position was created this year by the Nevada Legislature. Guy will preside in Las Vegas. The post pays \$30,000 a year.

Guy has served as the chief deputy district attorney since 1973. He began his law practice in Nevada when he joined the district attorney's office in 1966 as a deputy prosecutor.

A native of Chicago, the new judge had his schooling in that city and was admitted to practice before the Illinois bar in November, 1957.

He graduated from St. Benedict High School before entering Wilson Junior College and then Loyola University School of Law where he received his L.L.B. degree in 1957.

He was admitted to practice before the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit in February, 1964, and a month later was admitted

to practice before the United States Supreme Court. In December 1966, he was admitted to practice before the Nevada bar.

Guy served in both World War II and the Korean War. He has had service in both the U.S. Coast Guard and the Army. Currently he holds the rank of Lieutenant Colonel with the Nevada Army National Guard Judge Advocate Corps.

He has been active politically and in both business and civic organizations, and has served on numerous committees and organizations.

From 1957 to 1960 he was in criminal and civil practice and in Chicago served as assistant corporation counsel and defended the City of Chicago and police officers against charges of violation of civil rights and police brutality.

In Clark County he was with the district attorney's office in various capacities, being the chief deputy district attorney from 1973 to the present.

He was recommended for the judgeship by both prosecuting and defense attorneys in southern Nevada, the governor said.

Rent strike controversy builds up

Poor People Pulling Together (PPPT) has launched a move to start a rent strike against Westwood Park Apts., 1001 W. McWilliams St., according to a spokesman for that organization.

The spokesman said PPPT and the tenants of that eight-apartment complex have been planning the strike for sev-

eral weeks. "We just need to meet a few more times to get organized."

PPPT and the tenants are up in arms over no air conditioning, no hot water, leaking ceilings, broken windows and open sewers infested with flies, the spokesman said.

PPPT and the tenants blame these conditions on the management.

Management blames the conditions on the tenants.

Irv Rappaport, an agent for the New York based owners said, "We've done everything we could to upkeep this complex, but we just ran out of money."

"PPPT blames us for the condition of this complex. But we can't help it if someone is rip-

ping thermostats from the walls of the apartments, tearing out the sprinkling system and ripping off playground equipment."

He added, "I can sympathize with the tenants. Some of them don't have jobs; some are on welfare and they just can't pay their rent. And
