



Chaparral High School senior Rick Porter has been named the recipient of the first Peter Johann Memorial Scholarship to play soccer for UNLV, it was announced by UNLV athletic director Bill Ireland.

Ireland commented, "In complying with the wishes of Peter Johann's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth F. Johann of Las Vegas, the UNLV athletic department is pleased to award a full - ride athletic scholarship in soccer to Richard Porter, Jr." The annual scholarship has been presented to the university in memory of Peter Johann,1 who was killed in a freak sporting accident last October. Peter Johann, son of Las Vegas realtor Kenneth F. Johann, was a graduate of Army-Navy Academy in Carlsbad, California, and was working with his father at the time of his accident.

Porter, the all-conference goaltender for Chaparral this past prep soccer season, is con-sidered a very gifted athlete and student. The son of local television sportscaster Dick (Gregg) Porter, the younger Porter gave up less than one goal per game his senior season. He graduated from Chaparral with a 2.80 grade point average, in the upper third of his class.

In acknowledging the awarding of the first soccer scholarship ar UNLV, Rebel soccer coach Tom Khamis said, "Rick is a most worthy indi-vidual, I'm very confident that he will help our program starting this fall."

Starting his soccer carrer in the ninth grade at Valley High School. Porter was on the varsity squad within two weeks. Following his sophomore season with the Vikings, Chaparral was opened and he was transferred to that school for his final two seasons. Possessing outstanding leadership capabilities, he was team captain all four years he has played soccer.

Hoping to major in business management this fall at UNLV, Porter was coached at Chaparral by Cam Camillone and the highlight of his prep career was being selected the first team Southern AAA All - Conference goalkeeper this past sea-

Last year was the first regular season of soccer at UNLV, and, the new Rebels came in with a very respectable 8-3-3 record.

The UNLV athletic program and its annual scholarship drive have grown to such tremendous proportions over the past athletic year that the 14 scheduled thank you banquet has been moved from the Dunes Hotel to the larger Caesar's Palace Colosseum, it was announced by UNLV director of athletic fund-raising, Dr. Wayne Pearson.

Said Pearson, "The Dunes Hotel has always been just great to us; however, the growth of the UNLV scolarship donors listed and the appearance of Frank Sinatra have caused us to make the switch to Caesar's."

Not only will the banquet be held at Caesar's, but, because of scheduling conflicts, the date for the affair marking the end of the 1975-76 UNLV

athletic scholarship drive, is July 10. The move to Caesar's will not only provide ample seating for the over 2200 expected UNLV athletic scholarship donors, but also afford the opportunity for others to spend an evening with the UNLV Rebels and Frank Sinatra. Commented Pearson, "We have had numerous phone calls regarding tickets for the banquet alone, and, with the seating capacity of nearly 3000 at Caesar's, we should be able to accomodate just about every one wishing to attend the banquet. Tickets will be available through the University Rebels Club

office at 739-3614. UNLV is coming off nationally ranked seasons in football, under head coach Ron Meyer, and, basketball, under Jerry Tarkanian. Both football, which was 11-0 in the regular season in 1974, and basketball, which won the West Coast Athletic Conference championship, advanced to the NCAA playoffs for the first time in the school's history.

Pearson is very optimistic about the chances of this year's scholarship drive passing the estab-lished goal of \$400,000, which would make it the biggest drive ever. Scholarship pledges are being secured in three amounts-\$1,500, \$750, and \$375.
