
## Things you should know

## Dr. King s aide fighting

ATLANTA, GA.--The latest attempt to silence Ga. State Representative Hosea Williams, former chief community organizer for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and veteran civil rights leader, came last week through an alleged conspiracy between the State of Georgia and DeKalb County (the county from which Rep. Williams is elected) when DeKalb's Superior Court Judge Henley revoked the State Representative's driving license permanently.

Williams, president of the Atlanta Southern Christian Leadership Conference, purchased a 10-speed bike and rode it to the steps of Georgia's State Capitol where he announced that he was convinced there was a conspiracy to control, defame and silence him by revoking his license.

Reverend Williams, after stating to court officials that he was not born with a drivers license, stated, "I will not be silenced if I have to ride a bike or even skate for the rights of Black and poor people."

Even though the state law used to revoke Rev. Williams' license was only passed in 1972, some of the traffic violations used by the court went as far back as 1955, during Rev. Williams' early involvment in the civil rights struggle. In getting enough violations to revoke Rev. Williams' license, the court not only use traffic charges alleged against the civil rights activist over the past 10 years in Georgia, but covered areas across the United States where Williams led nonviolent direct action campaigns and where he complied a history-making record of 99 arrests.

"I could have saved my license," stated Williams, "had I gone down "Uncle Tomming" to the governor or the chiarman of the county commission. They've tried every possible way in the world to control me, but if Dr. King could give his life I can certainly give up a drivers license. I'll never turn back; I'll continue fighting for the rights of my people until we are free or until I'm dead. I MAY NOT HAVE A DRIVER'S LICENSE, BUT ISTILL HAVE MY DIGNITY AND SELF-RESPECT."
