## "Be 100" List published

Black Enterprise Magazine has published its third annual "Be 100" a listing of the nation's top 100 Black businesses. Announcement of those on the Be 100 was made at a luncheon hosted by Walter B. Wriston, chairman of the board of the First National City Bank, at the Bank's executive offices in New York. Those in attendance at the luncheon included Massachusetts Senator Edward Brooke and economist Dr. Andrew Brimmer, both of whom are on the board of advisors of Black Enterprise, and Earl G. Graves, editor and publisher of the magazine, as well as a number of other businessmen.

In announcing those honored, Graves observed that "despite the worst economic slump since the depression, total revenues for the businesses on the Be 100 were \$675.26 million reflecting an increase of \$7 million, or slightly more than 1 percent over the previous year's figures. While this is not a tremendous increase, it is very gratifying in that it does indicate stability and accomplishment on the part of Black Businesses who, under normal circumstances, find it difficult to prosper, and are always hardest hit in time on economic stress."

Among the companies represented on this year's Be 100, 84 have been listed in previous years. Of the 16 replaced by newcomers this year, five have ceased operations, ten failed to qualify because of low sales, and one has been absorbed in a merger.

Norman Lear announced on behalf of Tandem Productions, Inc. and TAT Communications Company the creation of and experimental program that would provide access and opportunity for minority career-oriented comedy writers to begin a professional writing career.

Bob Peete, story consultant on "Good Times," will head the program which is being offered under the auspices of both Tandem Productions, Inc. and TAT Communications Company on behalf of

their shows, "All in the Family," "Sanford and Son," "Maude," "Good Times" and "The Jeffersons."

Peete stressed "we are only looking for career-oriented comedy writers who already have the skill and knowledge of writing comedy for television, but don't have or don't know the avenues for getting their work to the proper people."

Sales growth was generally stronger among the middle and lower ranks of the Be 100 this year, with 50 percent of those on the list had exceeded \$4.525 million. Even the smallest company on the list had 1974 revenues of at least 2.5 million as opposed to \$1.6 million for the previous year.

Los Angeles-based Motown, for example, revealed a sales decrease of \$1 million in 1974, yet still managed to retain their ranks as number 1 for the third consecutive year. With the exception of Wallace and Wallace, which was established in 1972 and is among the newest firms on the list, all of the top ten were previously on the Be 100.

Businesses represented are wide ranged and include entertainment, publishing, cosmetics, supermarkets, food processing, automobile dealership, contracting and construction, real estate, insurance, beer, wine and liquor distributors, manufacturing, fast food franchising, retailing and hotel/motels. In spite of the energy crisis and escalating fuel prices, automobile dealerships once again accounted for the largest single group of companies (24) followed by manufacturers (20) and contractors (16). This year revenues for manufacturers were \$141.8 million, while automobile dealerships brought in \$122.7 million, even though both were tied at \$125 million last year.

While Be 100 businesses are located throughout the United States, they are heavily concentrated in major markets.
