Black Media Calls On Ford For Jobless Aid

SAN FRANCISCO(NNPA)--Seeking an answer to the constantly rising unemployment rate among Blacks, which exceeds 25 per cent, the National Newspaper Publishers Association has called on President Ford to declare all 10 per cent jobless communities as disaster areas.

And further, urged the President to hold a meeting with a Black delegation to devise programs and policies to meet the critical economic needs of Blacks and other minorities brought on by inflation and unemployment.

These and other demands were expressed in the resolutions unanimously approved by the Black publishers in their 35th Annual Convention recently which both Gov. Edmund G. Brown, Jr., and Lt. Gov. Mervyn Dymally of California addressed.

Other speakers included: Dr. Berkeley G. Burrell, president of the National Business League who received NNPA's Distinguished Service Award; Stanley S. Scott, special assistant to President Ford; and a "Black Unity" symposium chaired by Dr. Eugene Mitchell, St. Louis Argus publisher and head of Homer G. Phillips Hospital.

Employment Security Department Praised

CARSON CITY--The Nevada Employment Security Department ESD has received federal commendation for designing and developing a complex computerized system for matching job applicants to available jobs.

Nevada Job Service agency director Larry McCracken said U.S. Department of Labor official William Haltigan has written a letter praising the agency for "cooperation and dedication in demonstrating that the Manpower Administration and the state agencies have the capabilities to design and develop significantly complex system in house."

McCracken said the Department of Labor lauded the supervision of Frank Papaanni and the technical direction of Lee Fisher in the development of the system.

Papaanni is chief of automated systems for the state agency's Manpower Service Division. Fisher is a senior computer systems analyst. The system is designed to use video display monitors linked to a computer and operated by job interviewers. By punching in coded symbols, the interviewer can see on the video screen the job orders that meet an applicant's employment needs, instantaneously and accurately.

The system is now in use in Las Vegas and has also been installed on a trial basis in an office of the Oregon Department of Human Resources. Development of the system was contracted to Nevada ESD and developed in about a year. In the past, computer systems of this magnitude had always been developed by an outside contractor, Haltigan said.
