How your Electric Bill compares with those in neighboring Cities and States

COMPARISON OF RESIDENTIAL ELECTRIC BILLS FOR 1500 KWH CONSUMPTION¹ (Based on Rates in Effect in April, 1975)²

¹1500 KWH is the average 1974 monthly residential usage of Nevada Power customers.

²Source of figures: published rate schedules. Wherever a differential between winter and summer rates is in effect, summer rates are shown.

*NOTE: Many area people believe Nevada Power Company rates are low because we secure a high percentage of power from Hoover Dam. This is not true. Only 5% of Nevada Power Company capacity is from Hoover. The rest is coal-generated (60%), gas or oil generated (30%), or purchased (5%).
