UNLV CROSS COUNTRY INVITATIONAL

The University of Nevada, Las Vegas, Cross Country Invitational was a huge success. Eleven university teams, three junior colleges, fifteen high school and a field of 45 open runners competed during the morning.

Six runners were under the old course record of 19:19.6 set by Richard Sliney of Northern Arizona in 1972. Arizona's Ed Mendoza set the new record by running 18:49.8 for the four mile course. Two other runners were under 19 minutes and a total of 26 runners were under 20 minutes.

Four teams broke the old team record of 124:02.2 set by Cal State, Fullerton in 1973. The winning team was BYU with a total of 137:26.6, an average of 19:38.1 per man.

This next year we would like to introduce a new meet format. In order to attract more colleges and to further equalize the competition, we will split the race into two divisions. The breakpoint will be a team total of 147 minutes or 21 minutes per man. Coaches will have to declare which division they wish to enter by the entry deadline. However, teams will automatically be transferred into the appropriate division at the end of the meet. Both divisions will run in the same race, insuring that your excellent runners will have the competition.

The meet will be held on September 27, 1975 with the Open Division at 7:00 a.m. The University races start at 7:30 a.m.

Our award system would be the same for each division--Trophies for the first three teams and medals for the first five finishers in each race.
