

**V*A FACTS

Q -- The law provides a grant not to exceed \$3,300 for certain disabled veterans toward purchase of an automobile. If a veteran received this grant when the amount was lower, can he now use the difference toward purchase of another automobile?

A -- No; however, the law does provide for repair or replacement of adaptive equipment necessary for safe operation of an automobile acquired under this benefit.

Q -- I used the specially adapted housing grant when it was \$12,500. This grant has now been raised to \$25,000. Am I entitled to the difference on another house?

A -- No. This is a one-time benefit for eligible veterans.

Q -- I am a son of a veteran who died of service-connected causes. I received dependency and indemnity compensation after age 18 while attending college until I married. I am now 20 and divorced. Will benefits be restored since I am still attending school?

A -- Yes. DIC payments for eligible children may be paid between the ages of 18 and 23, while enrolled in a VA-approved school. Benefits are terminated when the child marries. Since Jan. 1, 1975, benefits may be restored if the marriage is terminated due to death or divorce.

RUBY SAYS

The Clark County Welfare Rights Organization has offered to take over administration of the food stamp program, in response to State Welfare Administrator George Miller's Statement Friday, that he would like to get rid of the program.

As President of CCWRO, I immediately responded. Many working families need and use the food stamp program during this time of economic crisis, and would be severely hurt if it were eliminated. The food stamp program is not a welfare program, and it serves many more non-welfare families than welfare families. In answer to Miller's statement that the program is wide open to fraud, I can only say that George Miller has a long history of rash scare statements regarding "cheaters" that are always exaggerated beyond belief. Then he later claims he was misquoted.

If Mr. Miller is so anxious to get rid of administering the program, CCWRO would be happy to take over that function. We already operate other food programs--we successfully operate a \$1.3 million WIC program on only a seven percent administration budget. George Miller's administrative budget is a much higher percentage.

Miller stated Friday, in an interview that he would like to see the food stamp program eliminated in Nevada, and have the money put toward direct cash grants. CCWRO would also like to see cash grants to ADC families raised, but ending the food stamp program is not the answer. The food stamp program has brought millions of federal dollars to Nevada in the past year, and these federal dollars could not go to increase ADC grants.

Nevadans should not be alarmed by George Miller's comments--the food stamp program is good for the people and the economy of Nevada.
