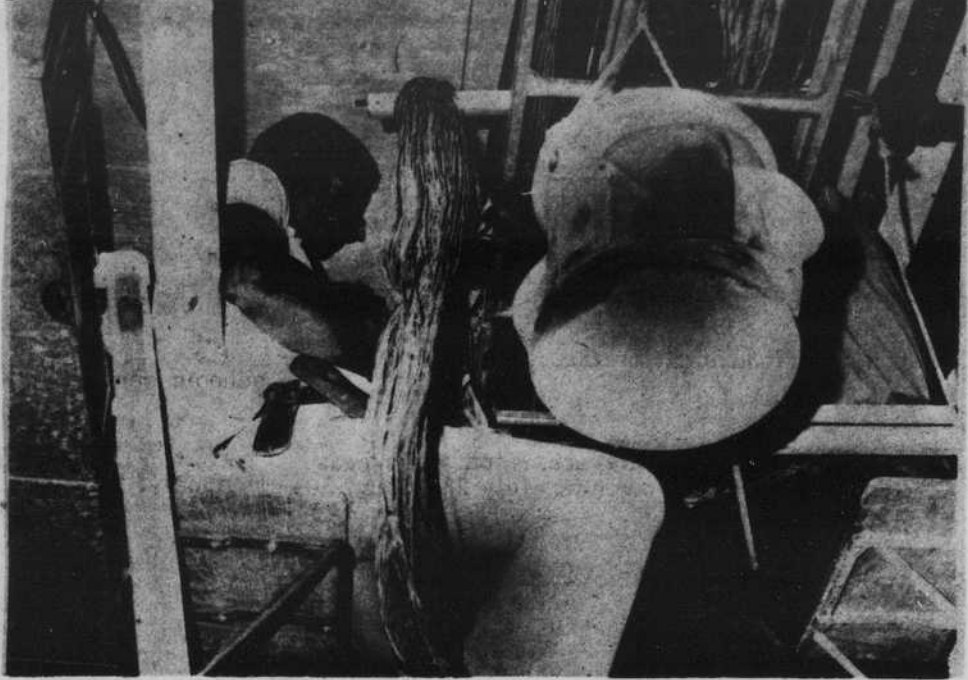

Censorship Threatens Education

The infamous battle of the books waged last year in Kanawha County, W. Va., is only the tip of the iceberg. Below the surface lies a right-wing-sponsored nationwide book-banning campaign which jeopardizes the education of millions of American school children.

In all parts of the nation, public officials and private citizens alike are debating the merits of long lists of suddenly controversial educational materials.

The current infatuation with textbook banning had seemed to many no more than a collection of isolated incidents. However, the National Education Association has identified six right-wing organizations--including the Klu Klux Klan and the John Birch Society--that have generated protests in school districts across the nation.

--In Vermont, the Mt. Anthony School Board voted down a gift subscription to Ms magazine.

--In New Hampshire, two legislators introduced a bill calling for a \$1,000 fine or a year's imprisonment for a public-schoolteacher who assigns books containing words defined by the state as obscene.

--In Prince George County, Md., the school board banned a film of Shirley Jackson's short story, "The Lottery."

--In Wisconsin, school boards and libraries have banned "The Godfather," "The Exorcist," "Catcher in the Rye," "Bury My Heart at Wounded Knee," and "The Last Whole Earth Catalogue."

--In Wilmington, N.C., the school superintendent gave in to the wishes of the county sheriff and withdrew from classrooms "The Curious Eye," an analogy of contemporary literature used in advanced composition courses.

--In Dallas, "Jaws," "Go Ask Alice," and "North Dallas Forty" were rejected by a school board screening committee.

--In Baton Rouge, La., school officials dropped a textbook called "Mass Media and the Popular Arts" because it includes excerpts from news stories about the 1968 Democratic Convention--including four-letter epithets used by protesters.

--In Randolph, N.Y., the school board removed 150 books from the school library. The controversial books included all books by or about Blacks or about the women's rights movement. The books included John Steinbeck's "In Dubious Battle" and books by Isaac Asimov, Kurt Vonnegut, Richard Wright, and James Baldwin.

In West Virginia, although the disputed books are back in the schools, they are not being used. The school boycott, on the surface unsuccessful, produced rigid regulations which most likely will result in eliminating all but the controversial books from use.

According to NEA President James A. Harris, there is a nationwide well-organized, well-financed resurgence of extremist activity which has focused on textbooks and other educational materials.

According to NEA policy, Harris noted, academic freedom is "the right of the learner and his teachers to explore, present, and discuss divergent points of view in the quest for knowledge and truth."

"There is a more or less informal, fundamentally conservative movement through existing networks such as the John Birch Society, conservative churches and such, and the word is spreading about various sorts of textbooks and library books," Harris stated. "We know it is organized. They use the same phrases and the same language in nearly all cases."

"It is the job of dedicated teachers and responsible parents to keep indiscriminate censorship from depriving our children of the education they need," President Harris said.
