Ashe piled up 221 points, with 55 votes for first, while Ms. King garnered 83 points, including 14 first place votes.

Whitney Young College Football Extravaganza Slated for New York

New York City's only college football extravaganza, the Whitney M. Young, Jr. Memorial Football Classic, will be played at Shea Stadium on Saturday, November 15, 1975. Festivities for the fifth Annual Classic will kickoff at 1:00 P.M.

The Classic will be a battle of champions with national Black College champions Grambling facing Norfolk State, champions of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (C.I.A.A.).

Sponsored jointly by the New York Urban League and the Coca Cola Bottling Company of New York, the Classic has attracted over 215,000 fans in the past four years, putting New York City back on the National football scene.

Chairman of this year's Classic is Claude "Buddy" Young of the National Football League, who is a member of the New York Urban League's Board of Directors.

Announcement of this year's Classic was made by Horace W. Morris, executive director of the New York Urban League, during a press reception at the Time-Life Building.

Morris stated, "this year's Classic is indeed a challenge to the New York Urban League. As one of our major fund raising activities, and with our organization having financial problems, it becomes vitally important that we fill every seat in Shea Stadium on November 15th."

Proceeds from the Classic help support many New York Urban League programs including the highly successful Street Academies.

Charles E.F. Millard, president of the Coca Cola Bottling Company of New York, declared, "the company is delighted to again join with the New York Urban League in this most worthy effort and to be part of the excitement and spectacle of the Whitney M. Young, Jr. Classic."

Coach Eddie Robinson will head Grambling College's Tiger powerhouse for the 35th year. He has compiled a 235-81-11 career record, second best among active college coaches. He has compiled a 236-81-11 career record, second best among active college coaches. Bear Bryant of Alabama University is the leader with a 242-71-16 record.

Robinson candidly sizes up the coming season by saying, "our strength is at quarterback, running backs, pass receivers, defensive front-four and kicking. Question marks on the team are linebackers and interior offensive line. Our weakness is the defensive backfield."

Grambling posted an 11-1 record in 1974, losing a squeaker to Alcorn 19-14, with whom they shared the Southwest Athletic Conference title. In the Tigers match with Norfolk state, they outlasted the Spartans 16-10 in a whale of a ball game that makes fans thing the two schools will put on quite a show at Shea Stadium in November.

Norfolk State (Virginia) had a banner year in 1974 with an 8-3 mark. They were 8-0 in the C.I.A.A., giving them the conference title. Head Coach William "Dick" Price was in his first year at the helm of the Spartans. He replaced Bob Ledbetter who left the school to take over as offensive backfieldcoach for the New Orleans Saints of the National Football League.

In five previous clashes with Grambling, Norfolk State had been soundly thrashed. But in last year's encounter, the Spartans from Virginia put a scare into the Tigers before finally losing 16-10.

Norfolk State had not enjoyed a winning season since 1962, with 16 seniors and 17 juniors making up the bulk of the squad this year, they are looking forward to even greater things for 1975.
