Mercury recording artists the Ohio Players won two top awards at the recently concluded NATRA Convention. The Players won Best R&B Single of The Y e a r for "Fire" and Best R&B Album of The Year, also for "Fire." NATRA is composed of black radio and television announcers nationwide.

The awards come just days after the new Ohio Players album, "Honey," was certified gold by the RIAA, their third such award since the group joined Mercury Records last year.
