

WRO planning strategy against Welfare Department

The Clark County Welfare Rights Organization (WRO) launched meetings Tuesday. to try and determine how to cope with the Welfare Department, which it said is abusing welfare recipients.

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The WRO will hold meetings in the West Las Vegas Library every Tuesday until a

plan of action is mapped out. Ruby Duncan, head of WRO, said her organization has no definite plan of action to take against the welfare department. We will just listen to the complaints and help them to decide what they want to do.

She said this department has been abusing its recipients for quite a while. She said the department has been terminating people without notice.

Tuesday her organization put out a list of do's for people on the welfare roles:

"If you receive an overpayment letter from the Food Stamp Office, go to the Clark County Welfare Rights or Legal Services right away. Before the date you are supposed to contact the Food Stamp Office, someone will contact it for you.

'If you have already signed a repayment agreement, come in anyway. It is harder to change, but possibly it can

"If you receive a termination letter from the Welfare Office, sign the bottom of the form, requesting a hearing. Your grant will then be continued until the matter is settled. Do this right away -within 10 days of getting the letter if you want to get your grant next month. Mail one
