** V*A FACTS RUBY SAYS

I recently was fortunate to attend a Conference in Washington, D.C., which marked the 55th anniversary of the Women's Bureau and International Women's Year. The Conference was sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor at the Washington Hilton Hotel.

The title of the Conference, "Women in the Economy: Full Freedom of Choice," implies many themes, and many subjects were explored during the sessions. It was a follow-up of the International Women's Year Conference held in Mexico City, and grew out of concern for how many women in the U.S. are treated in the job market, including what discrimination exists as well as what opportunities are open to women. The overall focus was on women and children in this country, what contributions women make and how they can achieve their right to rewarding work and recognition of their accomplishments and contributions.

There were many more women present than men, and most of the speakers at the sessions were also women. This was a welcome change to me, since most large conferences are dominated by men.

In addition, a great many different organizations and offices worked together to plan this conference, which is strong evidence that various women's groups can cooperate, combine their efforts, and strive toward a common purpose.

My general impression was that this was an excellent conference -- very informative and goodd experience.

The ideas expressed and shared by women in the sessions foretell the increasingly important roles women will play in our society, and the well-deserved and long-awaited recognition they will receive.

To this end, Harvard College was established in 1636. It raised the consciousness and self-respect of teachers and librarians alike who began to appreciate even more than in the past their responsibilities as guardians of the nation's heritage.

This heritage includes, not just history of Blacks off boats from Africa. Swedes saving money during the long winter snow in Sweden or Catholics paying homage to the Pope. But it also includes philosophical, technical, financial, accounting, managing, scientific, engineering technological and mathematical knowledge built up by Americans in all walks of life.

One might ask what does all this have to do with business? Well every library has books on business.

copy of the form to Welfare in the envelope they send.

"If you receive an overpayment letter from the Welfare Department, contact WRO or Legal Services. They will help you negotiate, and check to see if you really owe the money. If you do, they will help you get very low monthly payments.

"If you are terminated or not allowed to apply because of overpayment, immediately call WRO or Legal Services. The Welfare Department is

breaking the law.

"If you have information to report to the Welfare Department, do not mail receipts. Take the original and have them copy it. They should copy it while you are there, and get your copy stamped with the date. This is your proof that you gave them the information."
