

Behavioral program for preschoolers

A new program for pre-school children experiencing difficulties in behavioral development is being implemented by Children's Behavioral Services.

This Learning Center is to be housed in the agency's newly construction complex at 6171 West Charleston Boulevard. Projected date for beginning classes is October 1, 1975. The Learning Center will be offering services to children between the ages of 3 and 5 and for those who have not yet started the first grade. The program will be divided into two sessions. A morning session, to run from 8:30 a.m. until 12:00 noon. And an afternoon session, to run from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m.

These classes will be held in the agency's new pre-school classroom which is furnished with curriculum and equipment designed to effectively meet the individual needs of each child.

Upon entry into the Learning Center each child will be evaluated as to their behavioral, social and emotional learning problems. Based on this information, the Learning Center staff will design appropriate programs for each child.

Along with the individualized treatment for each child, parents will be trained in using effective family interaction techniques. This will enable the parent to improve the child's functioning at home.

Fees charged for participation in the program are dependent upon family income and the number of dependents in each family. Any party interested in this program may contact Steve Krueger at Children's Behavioral Services by dialing 870-9141.
