Minority Banks Make \$569 Million in Loans

Minority banks have proved their viability by extending \$569 million in loans to the communities they serve, the inner-city, according to Sharnia (Tab) Buford, President of the National Bankers Association.

Buford, who is also President of Douglass State Bank, Kansas City, Kansas, said the large amount of loans made by minority banks is particularly significant because a large percentage of their deposits are of a short term and volatile nature. Total deposits at minority banks are estimated at \$1.1 billion.

"It can no longer be said the minority banks are not responsive to the needs of the innercity, which is the main area served by these banks," Buford said.

"Through their sound and sensitive lending practices, these banks have made a meaningful contribution in real dollars to people who live in so-called red-lined areas that are economically deprived and depressed."

A major portion of loans made by minority banks are for new homes, expanded and new businesses, college education, home improvement, church mortgages, and consumer purchases, reported Anthony Maxwell executive director of the National Bankers Association which is the trade association for the nation's 82 minority owned banks.
