Jesse Owens on 'The Olympiad'

The only segment of 'The Olympiad' that American viewers might have seen before is "Jesse Owens Returns to Berlin," which was shown on ABC in 1972 and which won three Emmy nominations.

In the 1936 "Nazi Olympics," a Black American track star, Jesse Owens, won four Gold Medals. However, Germany's number one Sports Fan, Adolph Hitler, refused to shake the hands of the Black participants, provoking the United States team to refuse to dip its colors as it passed his box in review. The animosity stirred by the dictator displeased sports enthusiasts and officials in Germany, particularly after the war. In 1951, city officials invited Jesse Owens to return to Berlin to receive his long overdue acclaim. When asked how he felt about the fifteen-year-old incident, Owens showed his true graciousness by saying, "I'm here and he's not and that's enough for me."

It is the dramatic story of the triumph of a graceful human being over the forces of hate and prejudice.

To find out why athletes from the Soviet Union have become a dominant force in almost all phases of Olympic competition since 1952, producer Bud Greenspan went to the USSR and filmed "The Russian Athlete." Through the eyes of Russian contenders, coaches, and sports officials the film investigates the system and the psyche that have produced such stars as Kladimir Kuts and Olga Korbut.
