
Willie Neal Files in District "C"



Neal said the West German car maker will produce the new Rabbit model in this country and that two other states -- Ohio and Pennsylvania -- are currently bidding for the plant.

'If we could attract this company to Southern Nevada it would mean immediate employment for 2,000 persons and eventually as many as 5,000," Neal said.

"I am hoping that Gov. O'Callaghan and others will pull together to try to bring this industry here. It would be a tremendous help in curbing unemployment, particularly for members of minority groups."

Neal said he has contacted officials in Carson City as well as Senators Cannon and Laxalt and Rep. Santini. He has also written to County Commission Chairman Tom Weisner and Las Vegas Mayor Bill Briare.

Nevada is a perfect location from the standpoint of manpower, climate, favorable freeport laws, and tax structure and I realize it's a major project to undertake, but the results would be well worth the effort," Neal said.

Food Stamp Vouchers Slated to End

State Welfare agencies administering the food stamp program will not be able to authorize the acceptance of vouchers as payment for food stamps after April 30, 1977, under an amendment proposed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Under the current voucher system, operating in several states

eligible food stamp recipients may be issued vouchers by their local welfare agency. These vouchers are redeemable for food stamps by issuance agents. The local welfare agency then reimburses the issuance agent for the vouchers. In effect, the local agency is using the voucher system to pay

for a recipient's food stamp allotment.

The April 30, 1977 deadline will give state agencies sufficient time to phase out voucher programs without undue administrative hardship Local agencies that wish to continue to assist households in paying for food stamps may use alternative methods, such as direct cash payments to recipients.
