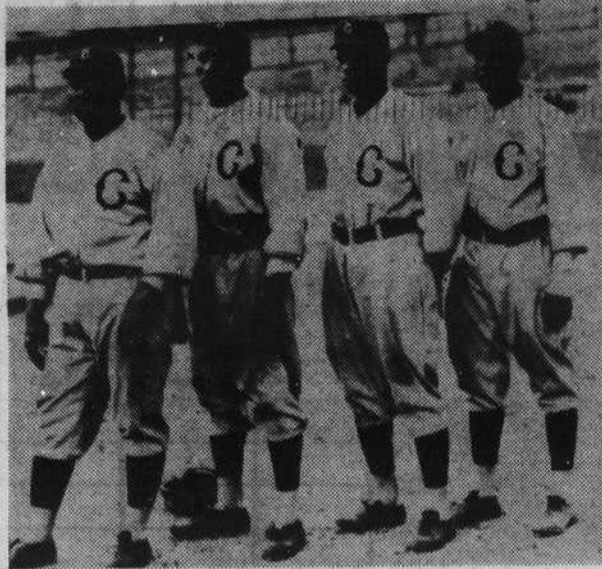

Oldtime, Negro Base ball Players



CREAM OF THE CROP — Four of the most brilliant ball players ever to perform in black baseball, from left to right, Oscar Charleston, Josh Gibson, Ted Paige and Judy Johnson. All but Paige have been enshrined in baseball's Hall of Fame, Charleston's entry coming in February of this year. None of these men made it into major league baseball when color barriers were dropped in 1946 because of their age. But, in the black league they were the 'superstars!'

"Who were the greatest of the oldtime, Negro league baseball players?" That question is being asked all across the nation today as movie-goers see "The

Bingo Long Traveling All-Stars and Motor Kings," a film about black baseball in the 1930s which stars Bill Dee Williams, James Earl Jones, and Richard Pryor.

The answer to such a question is never easy. In this case, we're dealing with an entity which began in the 1880's and existed for more than 60 years. Black baseball produced dozens of great players.

But, over the years, conversations with many surviving oldtime Negro league players, and research in public libraries, black history collections, and newspaper-magazine files have brought to the forefront the following great stars; their names are most frequently mentioned:

First Base — Walter (Buck) Leonard, Homestead Grays (a Pennsylvania team).

Second Base — Elwood (Binto) DeMoss Chicago American Giants.

Third Base — Judy Johnson, Pittsburgh Crawfords.

Shortstop — John Henry Lloyd, Lincoln Giants.

Left Field — Pete Hill, Chicago American Giants.

Center Field — Oscar Charleston, Pittsburgh Crawfords.

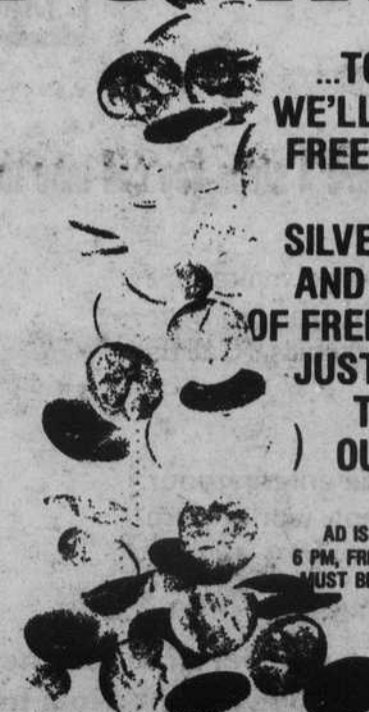
Right Field — Christobal Torrienti, Chicago American Giants.

Catcher — Josh Gibson, Pittsburgh Crawfords.

Pitchers — Satchel Paige, Kansas City Monarchs; John Donaldson, Chicago Giants; Bullet Joe Rogan, Monarchs; and Chet Brewer, Monarchs.

Swine Flu on 10

Channel 10 will conduct a panel discussion and phone-in special on the proposed 'Swine Flu Vaccine: National Immunization' Monday, July 26 at 7 p.m.
