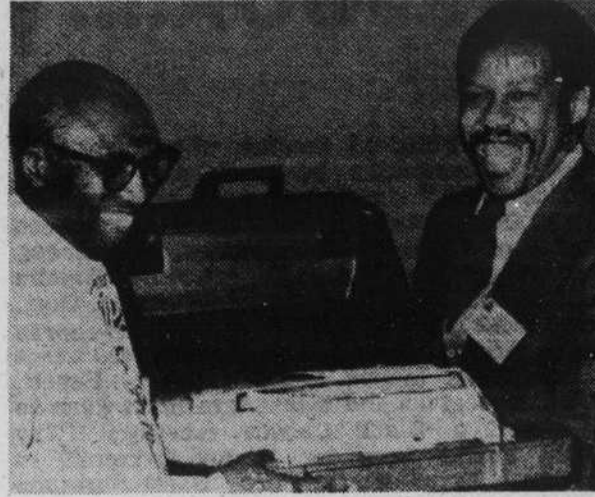

Hot Meals For The Elderly

A program to get hot meals to approximately three to four million homebound elderly was co-sponsored today by Nevada Sen. Howard Cannon.

"Getting nutritional meals to senior citizens where they live could help cut down on institutionalizing of the elderly and consequently reduce nursing home expenses," Cannon said.

In response to this compelling problem, many communities have organized volunteer Meals-on-Wheels programs funded by various sources. Unfortunately, these programs lack sufficient resources to serve more than a small number of these elderly citizens, and, in the absence of federal support are not likely to expand their services significantly.

These uncoordinated efforts served 240,000 people five days a week in 1975, Cannon said.

The Federal Trade Commission has by unanimous vote directed its San Francisco Regional Office to conduct an investigation into the effects of state regulations which prohibit dental laboratories from selling complete dentures directly to consumers and require that dentures be purchased only through dentists.

Pursuant to Commission policy, the investigation will be non-public. The existence of an investigation does not imply that violations of the law have occurred.

Jazz Greats Remember

When cornetist/composer Bix Biederbecke died in 1931 at the age of 28, only a handful of fellow musicians marked the tragedy. Years later, partly through Dorothy Baker's novel "Young Man With a Horn" (inspired by, but not based on, the Biederbecke story), he began to acquire the status of a legend.

Bix's friends gather to re-create his style and honor his memory on "At the Top" Sat., Aug. 7 at 8 p.m. on Channel 10.

Spotlighted in the hour concert is a younger man with a horn, Jimmy McPartland, who replaced Beiderbecke with the Wolverines, one of the first well-known white jazz bands.

Although the Beiderbecke legend has painted Bix as a gin-gulping, free-living symbol of the jazz age, McPartland recalls him in purely musical terms.

McPartland states: "The influence I most enjoyed was the Beiderbecke influence because of his nice, clear tone and nuances he played on the cornet. They were very pretty to me. They were very musical, lyrical. Everyone has to be influenced by something or another person. But you must be yourself."
