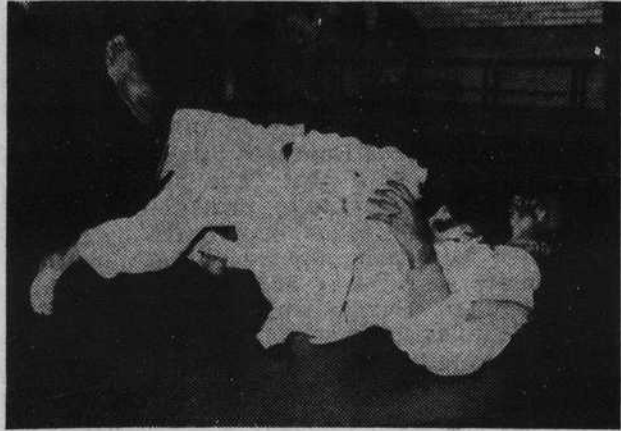

the U.S. and Russian teams.

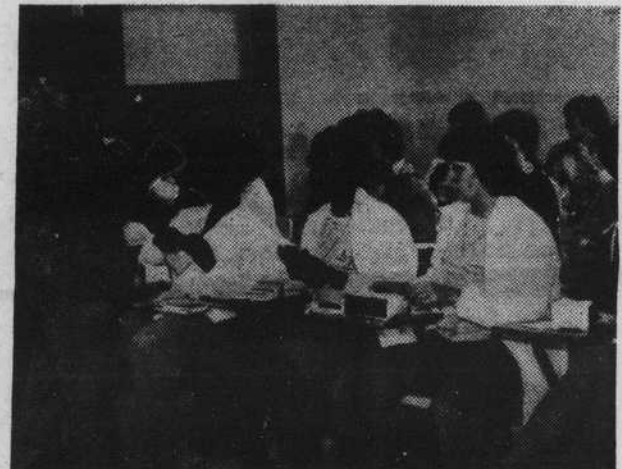

First, Second and Third finishers in each event will qualify to swim in the forthcoming Las Vegas City Swim Championships to be held Sat., Aug. 7 at Central Pool.

Finishers in the first three places of each event, in the Las Vegas City Swim Championships, will then qualify to swim in the Southern Nevada Recreational Swim Championships at Nellis Air Force Base on Sat., Aug. 14.

A one-time charge of twenty-five cents per event is payable upon registration.
