N'York City - "Guys and Dolls," born on the B'way scene with a heart in 1950, is alive and well again in '76 with a soul. The odds are 1000-to-1 that this marvelous sun-tanned, afrocoiffeured cast revival will be loved by the habituates of the illuminated lane for a long time. The opening night audience greeted it with contagious enthusiasm and combustible applause. Its success was a total cast effort which teatured thespians like Babe Wallace, Walter White and Ken Page high-lighting the starship of James Randolph, Ernestine Jackson, Robert Guillaume, and Norma Donaldson. The combined talent of its 36 cast members, and the guys and golls pit ork, added spice to the music and lyrics of Frank Loesser as they embraced the Joe Swer-ling and Abe Burrows book with love and care to make this the fastest musical to enter the B'way sweepstakes this season. Thank heaven for "Guys and Dolls" which proves that the play is the thing, and can be made by the players with talent which by and large is colorless.

Natalie Cole, the King's daughter, walked away with the grand prize of the Tokyo Music Festival. Her rendition of "Mr. Melody," penned
