Kayaker's Three Day Field Trip

Experienced kayakers can take a trip kayaking this month down the lower Grand Canyon in Arizona.

The three-day field trip sponsored by the Univ. of Nevada, will start at Diamond Creek on the Colorado River traveling to Pierce's Ferry at the head of Lake Mead through the lower 60 miles of the Grand Canyon.

Roy Evans, a local scientist who has learned the art of kayaking on mountain streams and rivers throughout the Southwest, will be the guide for this river journey for people who already know the basics of handling a kayak.

The non-credit course gets under way with a classroom lecture on Aug. 11. The river trip is scheduled Aug. 20 thru 23.

Johnson Honored For Soccer Guide

Cureton Lee Johnson, sports information coordinator for Howard University, has received honorable mention for his 1975 Howard University soccer press guide.

The announcement of the award was made at the recent national convention in Cincinnati of the College Sports Information Directors of America. A panel of judges made its evaluation on the basis of the guide's general information, layout and design. More than 100 universities and colleges in the NCAA I category were entered in the competition.

First place went to Cleveland State; second, to Penn State; and third, to Madison. Clemson University also received and honorable mention.

Governor's Cup Tennis Tournament

Dates for the 1976 Governor's Cup Tennis Tournament have been announced by Justice David Zenoff, Chairman of the Governor's Cup committee.

This year's tournament is the Eighth Annual event, and is open to all Nevada boy and girl tennis players, up to 18 years of age, at no charge.

The 1976 state finals will be held in Las Vegas, at the Las Vegas County club on August 28 and 29. The regional tournaments, which precede the state, have been scheduled for August 11, 12, and 13 in Reno; August 14 and 15 in Carson City, August 23, 24, and 25 in Las Vegas; and July 31 and August 1 in Elko.

Play is staged in Singles competition only in three divisions: 14 and under, 16 and under, and 18 and under for both boys and girls. In addition to the aforementioned categories there is a special category this year for girls 21 and under.

The deadline for age qualification is September 30, 1976, for all categories.

The Southern regional and the state finals are being directed by Chuck Kellogg.

The semifinalists in the regional tournaments will be eligible to compete for the state titles in Las Vegas. Transportation, food, and housing is provided for the semifinalists by the Governor's Cup committee.

Gov. Mike O'Callaghan will be in attendance at the state finals.

Entry blanks for the various regional tournaments are available at pro shops and tennis courts in Reno and Las Vegas.

A Peak Experience

Grambling

Thirty-seven former Grambling football players remain on rosters of professional teams in the National and Canadian Football leagues as squads start countdowns for the 1976 season.

The high number of former G-Men in pro-camps maintains Grambling's distinction of being one of the major producers of professional football talent. Grambling annually ranks with Notre Dame, Ohio State and the Univ. of Southern California as the top producers of professional football players.

Of the 37 ex-Tigers in the play-for-pay ranks, 30 are toiling in the NFL while seven are on rosters of Canadian teams.

Grambling is represented on 20 of the NFL's 28 teams.
