LAS VEGAS - Job increases in the service and trade industrial categories helped spark a

and trade industrial categories helped spark a reduction of six-tenths of a percentage point in the June seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Clark County, the director of the Nevada Employment Security Dept. said Wednesday, Job Chief Larry McCracken said total employ-ment jumped by 2,400 during the month, bring-ing the rate down to 9.2 percent. Unemployment edged upward to 300 while the labor force grew by 2,700 persons. "Job increases of 1,600 in the service cate-gory and 500 in trade marked the beginning of

gory and 500 in trade marked the beginning of the county's busy summer season," McCracken said.

He noted that while the increases were expected. the number of unemployed resulting from school closure for the summer was not as great

as anticipated. "There are more jobs and more people work-ing than a year ago at this time, and we expect this condition to carry on through the season," McCracken said.

Total employment tabulations for the year since June, 1975, showed 6,800 more workers in Clark County, a growth in the total labor force of 5,300 persons and a reduction in unem-ployment of 1,300.

"Some of the reasons given by motorists for buying these plates are: 'for fun,' 'for the pres-tige of it,' 'as a conversation piece,' and 'it's a new toy.' Owners of vintage automobiles may wish to order a personalized plate i.e. FORD 31. Business firms may wish to spell out their product on a personalized license plate," Foll-mer stated. mer stated.

mer stated. Personalized plates may be purchased not only by vehicle owners but by persons who wish to present them as a gift. The department has gift certificates which may be used at any time of the year to accompany the gift of personal-ized license plates to a relative or friend. A person's choice of letters and numbers to be on a personalized plate is limited to six

be on a personalized plate is limited to six characters and the combination is considered by the department's Personalized Plate Committee for its propriety before being issued. Also, a personalized plate letter-number combination must not be misleading or in conflict with any license plate series now issued.

Personalized plates may be used on passenger cars, trucks having an unladen weight of 6,000 pounds or less and trailers. They may not be

May Cause Eye Allergies

A noticeable increase in cases of eye al-lergy was reported in Eye, Ear, None and Throat Monthly. Among the reasons suggested by Sam-uel J. Taub, MD, are the increased use of eye makeup and particularly mascara and false eyelashes. Inflamed and runny eyes are common symptoms.

symptoms. Conjunctivitis, an inflamation of the mucous membrane that lines the eyelids and borders the front of the eyeball, can also be caused by scented cosmetics, powders, shampoos, hair-dyes, hairsprays and eye makeup, according to Dr. Taub. He cautions that proper use of cosmetics require clean hands and clean in-struments, and that eye products should not be shared. shared.


