

VOTER REGISTRATION **PROGRAM**

Clark County Welfare Rights organization is sponsoring a voter registration drive from now until August 14th, the close of voter registration. The offices in the old Cove Hotel at the corner of 'D' and Jackson streets will be open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Thursday and Friday, the 12th and 13th of August, and from noon to 4 p.m. on Saturday, the 14th, for the convenience of anyone wishing to register to vote. If people cannot make it into the office, they can call 648-0012 during those times and a deputy regis-

trar will be sent to them.

In an interview, Mrs. Ruby Duncan, President of CCWRO, stated the need for everyone to reg-
