Baseball May
Lose Exemption

W ASHINGTON (AP) --Four members of the
Select House Committee
on Professional Sports
introduced legislation
recently to take away
baseball's special status
under antitrust laws.

The antitrust exemption gives baseball the right to run its own bus-

ness as a monopoly.

The legislation, which will be discussed in full hearings before the sports committee in mid-September, would put baseball on the same level as the other major pro sports - hockey, basketball and football.

Chief sponsor of the legislation is Rep. Gilis W. Long, DLa., who has made it known that he believes baseball should put a team in the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans.

NASSAU, Bahamas - The Bahamas sent a contingent of athletes to Montreal for the XXI Olympic games, but another group of athletes is going to Canada later this summer for a different kind of Olympiad.

They are six determined members of the Bahamas Paraplegic Association, who will never throw the discus as far as some, or come close to record time in a 100-yard dash. They'll be representing the Bahamas at the 1976 Olympiad for the Physically Handicapped in Toronto in August.

At this year's events the athletes will participate in the 60-yard dash, the 100-yard dash, the javelin throw, the shot put, the discus, ping pong, and a new event - clubs. One athlete. Paul Amoury, will enter the slalom.

To see these young men perform their feats would be enough to convince anyone why the team's manager and therapist, Hugh Bowleg, prefers to refer to them as athletes.

"They have improved tremendously since April, when we began once-weekly practice for the Olympiad," Bowleg said. "We have moved to twice-weekly practice and will soon be training twice daily, five times a week."
