

McCarran Traffic Figures Up In 1976

Air passenger traffic volume at McCarran International Airport, Las Vegas, reached record levels during the first half of 1976 when 3,626,339 air passengers passed through the country's 21st busiest airport according to Director of Aviation, Earle A. Taylor. This record figure represents an 18% increase over the same period last year. Comparative figures for international and domestic travel for the same period are only up 12.3% indicating the Las Vegas market is contributing tremendously to these marked increases.

Similar percentages for June of 1976 were up an unprecedented 20.3%. Earle Taylor indicated these growing percentages were surprising considering the culinary strike early this year but further stated the increased charters (OTC's) servicing McCarran helped offset the potential decreases in total percentages.

Cargo statistics were also up over the same period last year when 13 million pounds of freight were handled representing an 11.4% jump.

Revision to ORV Regulations

Proposed revisions to federal regulations governing the use of off-road vehicles (ORV's) on lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) were published in the July Federal Register, according to John Boyles, manager of the BLM's Las Vegas district.

Under the proposed revisions, all BLM-administered lands, excepting existing primitive areas, are undesignated with regard to ORV use until they have been evaluated and designated in accordance with a 1972 executive order on management of off-road vehicles on federal lands.

Boyles said when the evaluation process is complete all BLM-administered lands in the district will be "open," "closed," or "regulated" with regard to ORV use.

A draft EIS, prepared by the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation in cooperation with other agencies, was issued July 22. It covered ORV use on lands administered by the Dept. of the Interior.

Parties interested in the proposed revised regulations have until Oct. 7, 1976 to submit written comments, suggestions, or objections to the Director (210), BLM, Washington, D.C. 20240. Copies of the Federal Register will shortly be available for review in the Las Vegas Downtown Public Library and at the BLM's Las Vegas District office.
