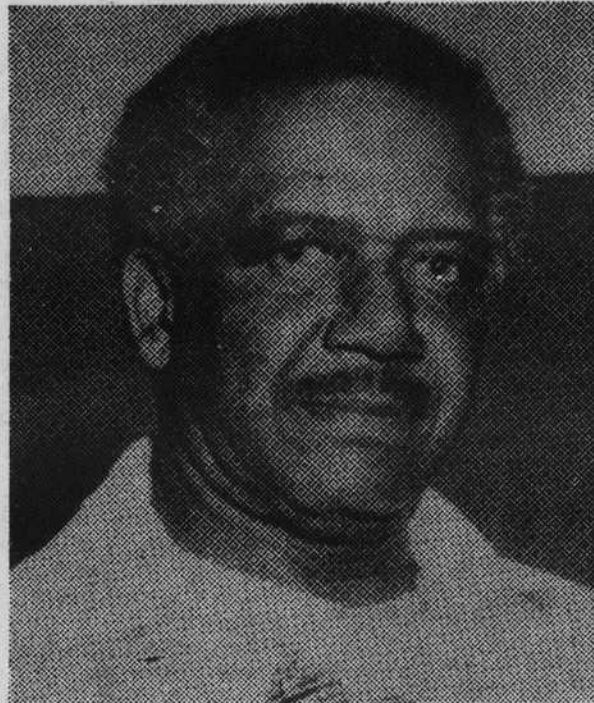

## 'Intolerance' at Cinema '76

Cinema '76 presents D. W. Griffith's silent epic "Intolerance" Sunday, Aug. 22 at 2 p.m. in the Clark County Library Auditorium, 1401 E. Flamingo Road.

Shuttling from eon to eon through the use of parallel editing, Griffith tells four stories of religious persecution; one modern, one Judean, one medieval and one Babylonian. Utilizing over 60,000 extras, "Intolerance" is easily one of the most spectacular motion pictures ever made, especially since many of Griffith's editing techniques became film standards in later years.

Starring Lillian Gish, Mae Marsh, Robert Harron and Miriam Cooper, "Intolerance" is presented free to the Public.

## Restrict Rate "Pancaking"

WASHINGTON - A bill which would dramatically alter the electric utility industry and its regulation was reported out of Senate Commerce Committee, Nevada Sen. Howard Cannon said recently.

Committee member Cannon said the bill is designed to enhance consumer service, restrict rate "pancaking" (new rate hikes added before old ones are approved) and provide closer scrutiny of so-called fuel-adjustment clauses (price increases based on fuel costs to utility company).

"By prohibiting rate pancaking during the initial 18 months in which a prior application for a rate increase is pending, and by no longer automatically allowing wholesale rate increases pending final determination, the consumer is protected from the threat of constant rate changes and uncertainties," the senator said.
