

German beer, Olympic gold medal winner Mark Spitz, wandering minstrels, jazz bands and a national cross country track meet are just a few of the activities lined up for the "Great American Fall Festival" at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

"We're expecting some 15,000 people here for the three-day event," says Richard Cole, chair-man of the newly-formed Student Association of UNLV. Plans are under way now for the festival which is set for Sept. 24, 25 and 26.

The festival is the first activity planned by a new organization composed of several UNLV student social groups and the Consolidated Students of UNLV

Cole said Mark Spitz, holder of a record seven-Cole said Mark Spitz, holder of a record sevengold medals in swimming, will officiate at a high dive championship and aqua-show on Sept. 24 as part of the festival. The event will be at the UNLV McDermott Physical Education complex. "Most of th activities will be outside in the plaza area of the complex," Cole said. "We will have food, entertainment, arts and crafts exhibits and plenty of action."

The festival will begin each day at approximately noon, but each night the plaza area will
