#### In Psychiatric Camps

The International Red Cross has begun negotiations with the South African government to determine guidelines for an investigation into charges that over 8,000 blacks are being held in psychiatric camps and hired out as slave labor to private business as a financial proposition

The investigation stems from accusations by the South Africian branch of the Church of Scientology and the Swedish newspaper Dagens Ny-heter, both of which have charged that patients in the institutions are improperly fed and clothed, are physically abused, and are being used private business under a contract between South African Health Ministry and the Smith-

Mitchell company. According to Rev. Christian Volz, spokesman for the Church of Scientology in Washington D. Jarl Hjalmarsson, former president of the Swedish Red Cross disclosed to the Scientolo-gists late last week that the International Red Cross in Geneva would indeed carry out an investigation into South African mental health

care. "We are extremely pleased," stated Volz, "that our efforts to expose the rotten conditions in these psychiatric camps are beginning to take on an international flavor. The United Nations has recently asked the World Health Organization to conduct a similar inquiry and we are awaiting a positive response. In light of the con-ditions in the camps, the W.H.O. will be amiss not to investigate."
