

### State Senator Lee Walker Reaffirms His Beliefs

State Senator Lee Walker, D. - North Las Vegas, recently reaffirmed his opposition to any legislation to consolidate government services without a vote of the people.

"This is one of the biggest concerns of the people of North Las Vegas," Walker said, "and voters have the right to know where the candidate stands."

Walker opposed the consolidation bill - subsequently declared unconstitutional during the 1975 session of the legislation.

"I opposed the consolidation bill then, and I will oppose any move which would cause the city of North Las Vegas to lose its identity," Walker said.

"The people of North Las Vegas and all other cities must have the right to decide in an election whether they want to consolidate services of government.

"It is the people who are affected by government consolidation, and it is the people who should have that choice."

Walker, a six year veteran of the legislature, is chairman of the Senate Committee on Health, Welfare and State Institutions, a member of the powerful Finance Committee, and vice chairman of the Committee on Government Affairs.

### Art Classes at UNLV

A more advanced watercolor workshop meeting Tuesday afternoons Sept. 21 through Nov. 9 will focus on landscape painting with participants working out of doors at selected locations.

Sister Regina Wojinski's oil painting workshop for beginners Sept. 18 through Nov. 6 will cover the study of color and color mixing. Also principles of design and composition, techniques and aesthetic problems.
