N'York City - How much is too much smoking, drinking, eating, polluting? How much is the too much that is bad for your health? What formula determines what is moderation, the prescription for safe and sane living? What prompts this lit-erary adventure into habits and abuses evolves from a recent seminar conducted by the Council on Alcoholism for Fairfax County. Fairfax is in Virginia, suh, a posh suburb close to the na-tion's capitol. It is a virtual bedroom for Wash-ingtonians and a lot of things go on there, tis ingtonians and a lot of things go on there, tis said.

The seminar was airmed at knuckle - rapping the news media for its failure to report what the news media for its failure to report what it said was a nationwide epidemic of sustained and undiminished liquor consumption which bo-des ill in generations yet unborn. Among other things, it called television a "Booze Tube." It said actors and actresses are never shown drinking a glass of water, but always dropping ice in a glass and melting it with such awful stuff as whiskey. The Council concluded that by a ratio of 264 to 1 TV drinkers (not viewers, mind you) are sipping ugly alcohol, not water, or fruit juices, or vegetable sap, or milk. The CAFC viewed with alarm that the high b 10,000,000 alcoholics cause an economic dislo-cation estimated at \$15 to \$25 billion a year... that alcohol is to blame in 15,000 homicides and suicides annually...that it causes 20,000 acci-dental deaths...that roughly half of all arrests and that dental deaths...that roughly half of all arrests can be traced to the use of the spirits...and that booze, "unlike heroin" damages the liver, brain, heart and takes away 10 to 20 years from life expectancy...that Washington boozers outdrank the rest of the country in 74 creating alcoholics by a ratio of 22,306 per 100,000 adults (one in every 5)...that it ranks #1 in cirrhotic deaths ... that 20% of all alcoholic women meet with violent death within two years of a "cure"... and that the press should be more responsible when reporting that a fire causing the death of five in a family was due to a "careless smoker" when in reality was caused by an errant drinker. So there it is. We have done our bit by report-

ing these sobering statistics. DOOMSDAY IS AT HAND - Oh, the Council on Alcoholism a Is o said that habitual imbibing brings us all close to Doomsday. But truth compels our reporting that the Council fell far short of requiring the Surgeon General of the United States to warn in no unmistakeable terms about
