


NEW YORK - The Converse Streakers have won the Robert Douglas Professional Basket-ball 1976 Summer championship in which top-NBA players, participate gratis, as capacity crowds watched two last-minute thrillers.

In the first semi-final the Douglas Rens Top-ped the Passport Scots 122-121, in the last two seconds of play. Harthorne Wingo, of the New York Knicks, registered 27 winning points while Larry Fogle, who reports to the Knicks train-ing camp in September, scored 39 for Passport. In the other semi-final, Converse beat the Lord Calvert Superstars, despite 21 points from Billy Paultz, of the Lord Calvert Team and of the San Antonio Spurs in the NBA.
