## Get into Shape with **Physical Education**

Get into shape for the fall by attending one of the physical education or recreational programs offered at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas through the Division of Continuing Education. Programs for adults, youth and children are starting from Sept. 21 through Oct. 13. Inter-

ested residents are encouraged to contact the Division of Continuing Education for information or registration.

The courses offered this fall: --A morning "Body Mechanics" class design-ed to help participants maintain good health and physical fitness through general and specific ex-

ercise programs. --"Children's Exercise" open to children be-tween the ages of 4-7 (includes tumbling, dance, yoga, karate and drama improvisation which en courages neuro-muscular coordination, strength

stamina, posture and personal discipline.) For youth between the ages of 8-16 a"Free Style Movement for Youth" program emphas-izes dance - moder, light jazz, character, ballet and social - which help improve body coordination.

-"Horsemanship," a 14-hour course with ten hours of riding experience, designed to in-struct the beginner in the basic skills of riding. --Two Saturday "Racquet ball" classes teach-

ing the fundamentals and strategy of racquet-ball, designed for the beginning and experienced

--A 60-hour "Scuba Diving" course includes 24 hours of theory-diving physics, physiology, medical aspects and scuba equipment; - 24 hours of skill training; - diving skills, procedures and techniques; - 12 hours of qualification dives. --"Backpacking," a class with a field ex-perience and a two-day field trip into the backcountry of Zion National Park, introducing back-

packing techniques to beginning hikers. --A combination lecture and field experience course on "Rock Climbing" to instruct and give experience to beginners on the essentials of rock climbing.

--Deisgned for the novice "Canoeing and Camping Adventure" covering basic canoeing theory and techniques and experience in setting up overnight camps. An overnight field trip on the Colorado River is included departing below Hoover Dam.

--Eight classes and a field trip for novice kayakers on the fundamentals of handling single kayaks in fast water and the types of boats and necessary equipment available for the sport.

## **Skateboard** Contest

Clark County Department of parks and rec-reation and Southern Nevada Skateboard Association will be sponsoring a Skateboard Contest Sept. 25 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Orr Junior High school.

Courses will be set up in three events: Slalom, Cross Country and Freestyle. There will be sep-erate events held for both boys and girls with erate events held for both boys and girls with eight age groups competing for awards. Our ob-jective is to help promote the fundamentals of skateboard safety, to bring together skateboard-ers of this area, and to have some fun to include friendship and clean competition. A special added attraction will be a demon-

stration of skateboard skills and technique put on by the Bains Skateboard Team from Southern California.

The Nevada Equal Rights Commission (NERC) will hold three public hearings involving five claims of discrimination beginning September 21, 1976 in Reno. There are two sex discrimination charges and three charges of discrimination based on race. NERC holds public hearings at the conclusion

of staff investigations when all attempts at conciliation have proven non-productive.
