Vocation Students Subject of New Study

Private vocational school students are more confident of their educational and career plans and more labor market-oriented than college students, according to a survey of 1,400 students entering 15 different types of private vocational schools across the country. Private vocational schools are market-oriented postsecondary institutions offering career training which will result in permanent job placement.

The survey, conducted in conjunction with the 1974 Cooperative Institutional Research Program sponsored jointly by the American Council on Education and the University of California, Los Angeles, showed that private vocational school students view themselves as less likely to change their field of study or career choice or to seek vocational counseling, and as more confident of finding a job in their field than college students. And, two-thirds of vocational students estimate that their chances of finding work are good, while only half of college students thought so.

Vocational education is rapidly becoming a major force in postsecondary education as students place new emphasis on career rather than liberal arts training, especially in light of the declining job market for college graduates. Last fall, vocational education enrollments increased a record 15-20%. Over 3 million students attend vocational schools.

Churches Go After Federal Files

Ten churches and religious organizations in the Southwest area have gone after their federal files which must be made available to them according to provisions in the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

The religious organizations, including the Franciscan Center (Fr. Louis Vitale), the Sunrise (a Unitarian newspaper) and Allen Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church (Rev. Albert Dunn) in Las Vegas; the Unitarians in Albuquerque and Tucson; the Society of Friends (Quakers), the Episcopal Diocese and the Pillar of Fire Church in Salt Lake City initiated action to obtain their files after members of the Church of Scientology in their city contacted them and offered education and legal assistance in utilizing the FOIA.

The total number of requests made by the churches to the FBI, CIA, IRS, Dept. of Defense, Secret Service, Dept. of Labor, Dept. of State and a number of other agencies comes to over 120, making the response in the Southwest the largest Scientology has received in the nation to their campaign of assistance to other churches.

Muhammad's Mosque of Islam, one of the two churches who first accepted Scientology's offer, was one of the churches on the 'Enemies List,' yet the IRS denied having files on the religion in their letter to the Mosque responding to the FOI request, and O'Brien says it will most probably take legal action to force the IRS to comply with the law and disclose the file on the Mosque.

Due to the considerable response the Church of Scientology recently formed the Freedom of Information Department, headed by William Null in Las Vegas and Connie Bowman in Salt Lake City, which will handle the requests of the churches and the responses by federal agencies to those requests.
