Gay fruther states that he plans to visit as many school sites as his calendar will permit prior to the election of new board members. Gay is the incumbent for District Seat C.

Presently, he has already made visitations to several of the District's schools, where he has been involved in installing PTA officers, talked with teachers about their concerns, surveyed students in regards to their educational needs, and talked with principals about many aspects of the school's operational entities. Gay's main areas of concerns as a board member are:

d) a vocational technical school located near the Cheyenne - Tonapah area of the community.


