Over 30 Basketball League



EBONY PATRIOTS'

The publication of "Ebony Patriots," and 18page booklet describing the participation of Black soldiers in the battles of the American Revolution in the New York area, will be announced at a reception hosted by New York University's Afro-American Institute on Thursday, Oct. 14 from 5 to 7 p.m. The reception, which is open to the public, will be held at the Institute of Afro-American Affairs, 70 Washington Square South, at the University's Washington Square campus.

Designed for an intermediate and high school readership, the pamphlet identifies.

readership, the pamphlet identifies -- and describes the exploits of -- twenty Black men who fought in the battles of Long Island, Harlem Heights, White Plains and Stony Point. The project was sponsored by the National American Studies Faculty, the subcommittee on Black Con-tributions of the Historical Committee of the New York Bicentennial Corporation, and NYU's Institute of Afro-American Affairs.

Dr. Roscoe C. Brown Jr., director of the Institute of Afro-American Affairs, chaired the subcommittee on Black Contributions which originated the project. Assistance was also given by Robert Williams, director of Community Pro-grams for the New York City Bicentennial Corporation and Dr. Ronald Lee Gaudreau, the Corporation's executive vice-president.
