


Clark County Commission Candidate, George Franklin has called for a revamping of the court system so that anyone arrested of a misdemeanor, is simply given a citation and a date to appear in court.

"It just makes good sense that with the over-flow in our jails, and with the shortage of police officers, a good citizen who is arrested for a misdemeanor, shouldn't be arrested," Frank-

It would mean that if a man or woman was arrested for driving under the influence of alchol, then his car may be impounded, however, he would be sent home in a cab, or driven home by the arresting officers.

A citation to appear in court would be issued, and the person would be tried for the misdemeanor.

Franklin, a longtime Nevadan, is opposed by Sam Bowler, a newsman.
