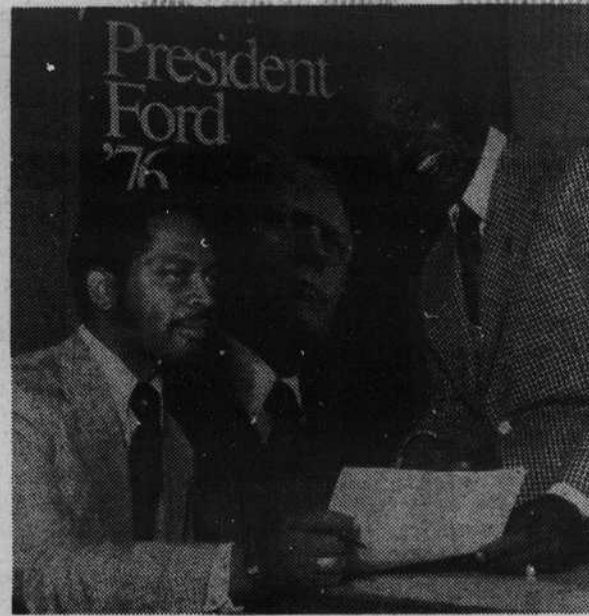
During her five terms as a Nevada State Assemblywoman, Eileen Brookman has gained overwhelming respect as one of the Legislature's most energetic members.

### Equal Rights Commission Quarterly Meeting

The Nevada Equal Rights Commission will hold its quarterly meeting Oct. 28, in Room 15 of the Las Vegas Convention Center at 7 p.m. Commission Chairman Robert Archie will chair the meeting which is open to the public.

Among items to be discussed are EEOC Commissioner Raymond Telles' charge against 19 "Strip" hotels' and casinos' hiring practices regarding Spanish-surnamed Americans, Women and Blacks; a status report on Public Hearings held and scheduled by the Commission; and the statutory changes NERC is requesting from the 1977 Legislature. There will also be time allotted for questions from the audience.

The Nevada Equal Rights Commission is a five-person Commission appointed by the Governor. Las Vegas attorney Robert Archie is Chairman; the other Commissioners are: Raymond Anderson, Adolph Salazar, Jerry Holloway and Virginia Mallin.

### Equal Rights Commission Public Hearing

The Nevada Equal Rights Commission will hold a public hearing on October 28, 1976 at the Las Vegas Convention Center, Room 15. The hearing - Hall V MGM Grand Hotel - will begin at 9 a.m. Hall V MGM Grand Hotel is a complaint in the area of employment; Hall has charged he was terminated because he is Black. The Commission has completed its investigation and because conciliation efforts have not proven successful, a public hearing has been scheduled. Las Vegas attorney Earle White will be the Hearing Officer.
