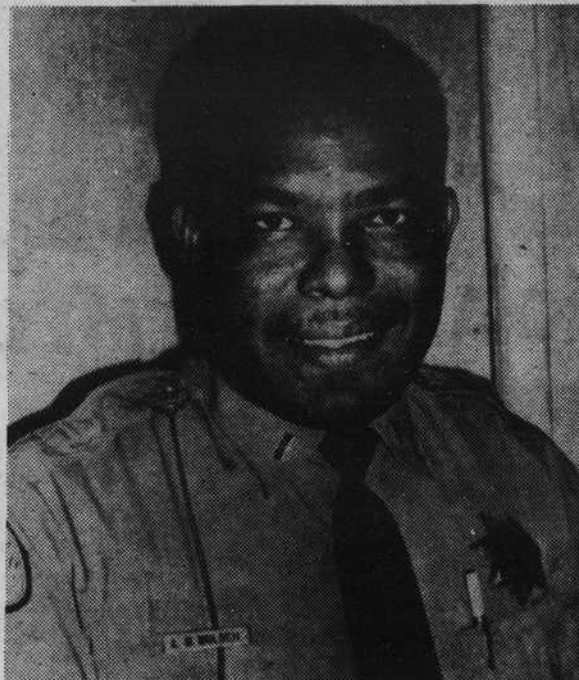

EDITORIAL A Tribute To Judge Compton

EDITORIAL, reprint from the Las Vegas Voice

In this season when we are all reminded of brotherhood, goodwill, the renewal of faith and hope, the entire Black Community must salute the Honorable Judge William P. Compton.

We do not know his politics of personal philosophy - But this we do know - That his courage and integrity in spite of racism opinions and pressures did uphold the law and mete out Justice in the case of Lt. Larry Bolden - renews our faith in the American Justice System.

Judge Compton orders Bolden's promotion to Captain. Lieutenant Larry C. Bolden's 3 year battle to receive his promotion to the rank of Captain was brought closer to reality Friday morning - Judge William P. Compton ruled that the city must raise Lt. Bolden to the rank of Captain.

Judge Compton ordered that the controversial findings of the Civil Service Commission be set aside. He further ordered that Bolden be paid such salary, retroactively to the time that he should have been properly certified and raised to Captain.

The City Attorney had used every legal maneuver to block Bolden's certification and his announced goal of having Lt. Bolden removed from the department. Seeking postponements, one after another, plus a time consuming appeal to the State Supreme Court.

Judge Compton in making his decision stated that a significant part of the testimony received by the Board was clearly inadmissible opinion evidence, and should not have been admitted or considered, since none of the 10 persons present at the review session could or did testify that they SAW Bolden change any answers.

The Civil Service Board denial of Lt. Bolden being certified was an abuse of the Board's discretion.

We feel our own courage and faith surge to a new high. We feel that Judge Compton rendered the ONLY possible just decision.

We Salute you, your Honor. Know that the Black Community is renewed, revitalized by your courage. When crisis are encountered as the State and the Nation strives toward total realization of the American dream for all Citizens regardless of race, creed or color we shall remember Tall Americans like your Honor.
